IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

In all matters, the Chief Controller's decision shall be final.

It is a condition of entry that players agree to their grading information being published on the ECF Website.

The Organisers reserve the right to transfer players from one section to another or to refuse entry to any player without giving any reason, and to merge sections and/or to increase or reduce the prize fund and its distribution depending upon entries.

No player may win more than one prize. Ungraded players may not win a grading prize. Grades used will be those at January 2016. In the event of ties, all money prizes will be shared equally, while British Championship qualifying places will, if necessary, be determined by sums of progressive scores.

A junior is a player born on or after 1 January 1998. A slow starter is anyone who starts with 0/2 or 1/2/2.

Anyone arriving more than 30 minutes late for any round will be defaulted that game. Expect to be re-paired after 30 minutes if your opponent defaults.

Mobile phones must be switched off in the playing area. Any player whose mobile phone makes any sound during play, or who is found to be using or consulting any device capable of suggesting chess moves, will be immediately defaulted that game.

Free tea and coffee will be available during the Congress.

The highest placed eligible player in the Open Section not already qualified will qualify for a place in the 2016 British Championship, to be held in Bournemouth from 25 July to 6 August 2016.

In addition, the EACU player with the highest aggregate number of points from their **best two** results in the top section of the three 2015-16 EACU Congresses, namely the Bury St Edmunds Congress in October 2015, the Great Yarmouth Congress in April 2016 and this Congress, will, if eligible and not already qualified, be offered the EACU nomination for the 2016 British Championship. If this person is already qualified or does not wish to take this place, the EACU nomination will be given to the eligible EACU player not already qualified who has the next-highest aggregate number of points from their best two results in the top section of the three Congresses mentioned above, and who accepts this nomination. (An EACU player is one who currently lives in, or has for a consecutive 5 year period lived in, or is currently at full time education in, or was born in, or is currently a member of a club in or affiliated to, Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire, Hertfordshire, Norfolk or Suffolk). In all cases, the nominee must have scored at least 50% in the two tournaments used to calculate their best two results.

All qualifiers will enter the British Championship at their own expense.
